
JANKI PATEL | 2017

EWNET AYISSA | 2019

Ewnet Ayissa was 13 years old when he moved to Atlanta with his father from Ethiopia; his mother remained in Jimma. At a young age, Ewnet found himself in a new country, at a new school, learning a new language and taking on many of the duties his mother would have handled: cooking, cleaning and laundry. While juggling these activities and the challenges of school, Ewnet worked weekends at Publix. As one teacher wrote: "Ewnet's parents sacrificed...because their goal for him was to get a first-class education. He will be the first member in his family to graduate from high school and attend college". Ewnet writes, "By overcoming the challenges of establishing a life half-a-world away from home, I needed to be mentally and physically strong... Working towards what is important may seem impossible, but it is key. Things may be overwhelming, but if we have faith in God, He will lead us --- one step at a time." At Cristo Rey, Ewnet was a standout soccer player and he now is a member of the Oglethorpe soccer team. He is planning to pursue a degree in Business.



MJB IN THE COMMUNITY

On Saturday, December 15th, the 11th Madeleine Jude Brown Invitational Swim and Dive Meet was held at the Georgia Tech Aquatic Center. Several board members and dear friends were present to greet swimmers and their families. Chris Marshall, the new coach at Marist School, coached Madeleine at Emory University and organized the meet that included 25 schools and 700 athletes. The MJB Meet continues to be one of the largest high school swim meets in Georgia. This year's meet will be at Georgia Tech on Saturday, December 21st.



The MJB Foundation continues to support Mercy Care which provides medical care to underserved communities. Mercy Care operates 11 clinics throughout Atlanta and extends Primary Care and Mental Health services to homeless camps through its Street Medicine program.
